

#### 1a. If you selected "Agree" please provide an example of how the community table is inclusive and diverse

Staff who provide support for Aboriginal children are on the committee.

Consists of members from community services, literacy, health, MCFD, aboriginal services, business, parks and rec, IOP, IDP. MACL

Monies allocated are being used to target aboriginal parents and children, but are inclusive to others, places are chosen to hold workshops that are more comfortable for aboriginal people to be. Example an amenities room in an aboriginal housing project.

Diversity is demonstrated with representation from business, non profit and private sector, aboriginal or those who work with the aboriginal community, school reps, public health, people who work with children with special needs...

Many representatives from social and health agencies although could be more from business and aboriginal. However I think this is not from lack of trying to be inclusive.

Representative of most social services in the community, representative of the cultural mix, age and gender perspectives diverse groups involved....maybe business sector missing?

We have a good variety at our ECD table. There are people from the school district, library, aboriginal organizations, union gospel mission, public health, women's resource society, the arts council, metis association, Mission Literacy Association, Mission Association of Community Living, and MCFD.

## 13a. If you selected "Agree" please provide one or more examples of increased accessibility for these client groups

Free low cost programs offered through grants awarded. More funds are needed as we had to turn some groups away or limit their services by not providing the full dollar amount that was requested. Strong Start Program and Community Services Programs helping immigrants and refugees.

There has been an increase in the number of programs offered in different languages to people in our community. We are presently in the process of establishing a mobile bus service, so we are able to take our services out into the community (high needs areas).

Some services are offered in the later afternoon and evening.

Example-ECD Committee is taking the lead on the development of a Community Bus which will bring services to those who cannot come to central service locations.
